



Theatre Scholarship

Awards range from **\$500** to **\$2,500**. These awards are renewable for the three remaining years of your Muskingum education, and are separate and distinct from federal work-study programs. In addition to awarding scholarships, the Theatre Department also employs 8-10 work-study students every semester. Any student can apply to work in the department for a paycheck and still receive a Theatre Scholarship award.

To be considered for an entry level Theatre scholarship (\$500), students must:

1. Be admitted to Muskingum University as a full-time entering student.
2. Submit the online application form and other materials no later than **March 3rd, 2023**. The online application can be found at: <https://www.muskingum.edu/financial-aid/comm-scholarships>

To be considered for a higher-level scholarship (up to \$2500) students must complete the above and additionally:

1. Provide a resume or list of your theatrical experience. Please list both acting and technical experience. Include the name of production, role(s), dates (s), and director's name.
2. Audition (Performers) or Interview (Off-stage roles). Students can audition and interview in person by emailing cmt@muskingum.edu to set up a time. Additionally you can submit a pre-recorded video audition of a 90 second memorized monologue, or schedule a video call audition or interview by emailing cmt@muskingum.edu.
3. Technical theatre applicants can also provide a portfolio of their work if available.
4. Complete the above by **March 3rd, 2023**

Scholarship Requirements:

You do not need to be a Theatre major to receive a theatre scholarship, but may choose to major, minor, or simply be a participant. If you've retained your scholarship all four years at Muskingum, by the time you graduate you'll accumulate enough credits for at least a minor in Theatre. Many of our scholarship students combine their love of theatre with other areas of interest and choose to double major.

To maintain eligibility, a Theatre Scholarship recipient must:

1. Maintain a minimum of a 3.0 GPA (on 4.0 scale) in Theatre courses, and a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
2. Enroll in at least one Theatre course each academic year at Muskingum.
In your first year at Muskingum, you'll take Acting I (THEA 275), and Technical Production (THEA 245).
3. Be involved in one or more on-campus productions per semester during sophomore, junior, and senior years.
4. Attend meetings publicized by the Department of Communication, Media, & Theatre that pertain to majors and scholars. Maintain set established policies of departmental scholarship activity.
5. Participate in the scholarship review process at the end of each semester, according to departmental policy.
